

Year 7 Term 2: *If God is Trinity, what does this mean for Christians?*



Theology = this is about *'believing'*.

It looks at where beliefs come from, how they have changed over time, how they are applied in different contexts and how they relate to each other.

Key vocabulary

Ascension = To rise; when Jesus ascended into Heaven after His resurrection

Creed = A statement of belief

Empowering = To become stronger & more confident

Monotheistic = To believe in **ONE** God

Pentecost = Festival celebrating the descent of the Holy Spirit to Jesus' disciples

Trinity = ONE God in 3 persons

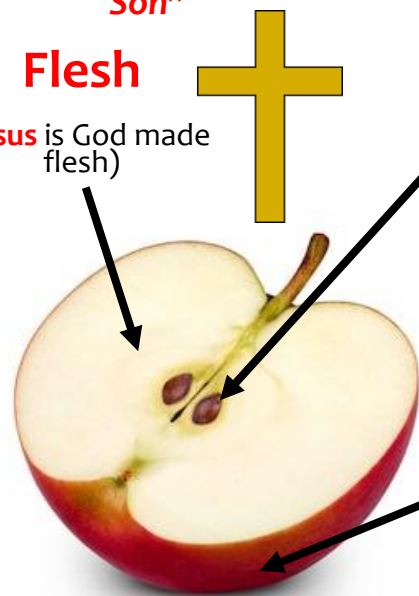
Transcendent = Beyond human understanding

Resurrection = To rise from the dead

The term 'Trinity' is an *attempt to make sense* of the way the Bible describes God as being present in three ways, or being indivisible persons in one being. We can attempt to describe God using *analogies, symbols and metaphors* but God is **transcendent** and, therefore, beyond any human capacity to grasp in words. The Trinity is one such attempt.
