

The Qur'an is divided into 'Surahs'. Along with the Qur'an, Muslims will also look to the Hadiths and the Sunnah to help them understand Allah's words




Once a year, Muslims from around the world gather together in Mecca and stand before the Ka'bah praising Allah together.
