Year 8 Term 5: What is so radical about Jesus?

Theology = this is about 'believing'. It looks at where beliefs come from, how they have changed over time, how they are applied in different contexts and how they relate to each other.

Key vocabulary

Rebel = a person who rises in opposition or armed resistance against an established government or leader; a person who resists authority, control or convention

Pharisees = A Jewish sect, distinguished by strict observance of the traditional and written law. **Criticism** = The expression of disapproval of someone or something

Adultery = cheating on your spouse (husband/wife) Parable = a story told to teach a moral or a lesson Radical = wanting to change an established order or behavior; going against the 'norm' Manifesto = a published declaration of the intentions, motives, or views of the issuer, be it an

individual, group, political party or government Meek = Quiet, gentle, and easily imposed on; submissive

Mild = Gentle and not easily provoked

Zakat = Compulsory giving; 'purification' of the heart from greed; 2.5% of annual income; more of a tax than charity

Sewa: Selfless service to others

What evidence do we have that Jesus could accurately be described as 'meek' and mild'?
