Sparx provides a highly personalised weekly homework to students, tailored to their attainment level and working speed. Sparx is an evolution of Hegarty Maths, and will therefore completely replace Hegarty as of September 2023.

Your child's homework will be set weekly and put on Satchel One by the class teacher.

We hope you agree that Sparx will play an exciting and important role in growing your child's understanding, success and confidence in maths.



Y8 and Y9 Science Trip to Amsterdam

On Monday 5th May at 5am while most Deanery students were fast asleep in beds, we boarded our bus ready for the 14 hour drive to Amsterdam. Our four day excursion involved travelling through a scale model of the human body as a blood cell in Corpus, exploring space missions (and climbing frames) at Space Expo, entering a fully interactive museum at NEMO, learning about all things tiny in Micropia and observing real human bodies donated to Science in Body world.





The students were incredible ambassadors of the school and us staff were privileged to experience this trip alongside them, although it is a shame Miss Case didn't risk assess the Lego Store as that was the biggest hazard for our students (or at least their wallets)!!

The biggest highlights of the trip were absolutely the Corpus Museum and NEMO. Corpus allowed us to observe the human body from the inside. Seeing all the organs at such a large scale was incredible and the audio guide made for some hilarious memories. NEMO is a beautiful museum on the harbour in Amsterdam. The museum is 100% interactive and tactile. Every exhibit is designed to be touched and played with, the best way to learn! Student favourites included the

bubble zone, dam building, forced perspective room and friendship tests. Watching the students interacting with Science experiments with big grins on their faces was a privilege to see as a Science teacher.

A big shout out has to also go to Zac our driver from Barnes coaches who is definitely now an honorary member of the Deanery family. We can't wait to see him in February 2024 when he drives us to Disney!

We had such an amazing time on the Amsterdam trip and I know that memories from this 4 day venture will stay with us for the rest of our lives!

We have all noticed a significant improvement in the students' uniform over the last two terms and would like to thank you and the students for your efforts with this.

Research tells us that wearing a uniform sets a boundary by placing a student in a 'working environment' mind-set and helps them separate their home and school life. School uniforms place children on a level playing field, reducing the pressure to wear the latest fashionable brands. It also shows pride and identity in the community they belong to.
