PE Update – Mr.Harmer

The Deanery hosted round 3 of the Year 7 Swindon Schools girls football with 5 schools playing a round robin of fixtures on the schools astro - it was a brilliant event showcasing some excellent football, with our Y7s winning 3 games of the 4. We are hopeful that they will now progress through to the finals in January.

The Year 9 boys lost to Bradon Forest in the semi-finals of the Swindon Schools Basketball, but put in a sterling effort.

The Y8&9 girls football team travelled to Kingsdown School in another round robin fixture, playing 4 games, drawing 3 and losing 1.

Pastoral Update – Ms.Parry

We have developed a real culture of positivity within our school. Over term 2 alone we have awarded students with nearly **90000** house points and are rewarding 9 times more than sanctions are given. This is a real credit to our students who are working hard to flourish and achieve every day in school.

This term's top tutor groups for each year group are: 7GXH, 8MXE, 9SZC, 10CJN and 11BXH. Well done to those groups for this amazing achievement.

After we return to school for Term 3, students in reflection will be expected to stay in school until 4pm as part of the internal suspension sanction. Whilst in reflection, the staff manning the room will do some restorative work with students to try and work with them to reduce the behaviours that led to them being in reflection. Y11 Maths Excursion – Mrs. Koza

On Tuesday this week, we took ten of our most able Mathematicians to Commonweal for an inspirational talk from Mathematician, Ben Sparks. Ben talked about the creation of numbers and the entertaining journey through humanity's mathematical attempts to wrestle with the deepest questions behind our day-to-day use of numbers, and their consequences. He asked pupils 'Where do numbers come from?' Pupils explored the philosophy of Maths behind everyday examples and familiar numbers. Pupils also had a glimpse of what lies beyond your understanding of the real numbers and how abstract mathematical ideas have changed the world we live in. Pupils were left thinking whether Maths is created by us, or are we discovering eternal truth?

Attendance

(Priority 3) Overall school attendance has improved over this term for the school, we have also decreased the number of late attendances in the morning. Thank you for your support with this. We are heartened that our Y7 attendance figure for the term is now above both the Swindon and National averages. We will be focusing on all years after the Christmas break to improve the whole school average attendance figures.

Since my appointment as headteacher, I have worked diligently with our HR, Finance and Marketing staff members to swiftly address our recruitment and retention strategy. As a result, we expect to welcome new Deanery staff in January, including those from Maths, English, PE, Art and DT and IT specialists.

(Priority 1 and 6) Our January training day will include a focus on Knowledge Organisers as we look to further support our students in not only learning the key components but most importantly building their schemata; increasing the accuracy and automaticity of their recall to ensure that knowledge is secure across the curriculum.

(Priority 1 and 6) The focus on Teaching Like A Champion has seen a significant improvement across the teaching approaches which in turn, is helping students to understand how to learn more and remember more.

(Priority 1 and 6) Further networking opportunities and cross collaboration will focus highly next year including moderation of assessment across all subject faculties. This will support the school in ensuring our judgements are accurate and that progress is identified quickly to allow areas of weakness/support to be swiftly addressed.

Mrs. Scotford has been updating the school website with dedicated Y11 resources. You can access this <u>here</u>. So far, we have added the PowerPoint and the resources from the 4th December 'How to Revise' workshop and also a copy of the January mock timetable. Hopefully this is useful information for you to access if you have a Y11 child at school.

In my briefing this morning with staff, I shared how blessed I feel to be offered the role of Headteacher and to have received the staff's positivity and encouragement. I want to take this opportunity to thank you for your kindness and invaluable support which I have truly appreciated. Each child deserves every opportunity to be valued, to be respected and to flourish and I will do my best each day to lead the Deanery staffing team to achieve this.
