Swindon Schools Average attendance is **89.5%**, The Deanery whole school attendance **89.5** %. Just after OFSTED our overall % was 86% and the Attendance Team set themselves a target to equal or be greater than the Swindon schools average by the end of the academic year. They have absolutely achieved this already, with determination and hard work from the whole school team. Thank you and well done!

We know that holidays are important family events, however, time away from school equates to hours of lost learning. Please consider this when taking your child on holiday during term time. Absences during term time will not be authorised and subject to a local authority fine.

Safeguarding (Miss Luckman)

(POAP 6) In the final term of the academic year, we have collated both student and staff voice in school, inclusive of our Academy Council, and this is such an important exercise to complete, to support making beneficial improvements. We will also look to collect feedback from our families in the new school year, so that we can drive these developments forwards together in the local community.

Following several incidents regarding 'sexting' in years 7-9 primarily across the town, we are working with our attached PCSOs, Justine and Vicky, to plan assemblies and workshops in the new year. SMASH Youth Project are currently working with a cohort of year 9 students and holding a weekly clinic in school, centred around Safer Relationships, which has been extremely positive.



It was Knife Crime Awareness week last month and we ran relevant assemblies, with a tutor session and signposting. We continue to have a strong working relationship with Wiltshire Police, being one of two schools in Swindon volunteering to have the Knife Arch for a day, to fundamentally, highlight to students and families the importance of keeping safe. Students were fantastic and asked mature questions, with most of them willing to have a go.

Please be aware that Swindon are concerned presently with nitazenes now making their way onto the market. These are not approved and found in the form of powder, pills or even liquids found in vapes. They are very dangerous, and consequences can be fatal if consumed.

PE and Enrichment (Mr Harmer)

(POAP 1 and 4) This summer term has been a busy schedule of athletics, cricket and rounders fixtures.
